

## **Stan's Paw Print Ornament**

We're sure you love your pet just as much as the Jennings-James family loves Stan. What better way to show everyone how much you love the four-legged members of your family than with these custom paw print ornaments? They also make great holiday gifts!

## Reminder

Only a grown-up should do the baking and cut with scissors.

## What You'll Need

- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup salt

Butter knife

- 1 cup water
- Parchment paperScissors

Baking tray


Decorative ribbon

• Straw

- Decorative ribbon
  Optional: permane
- Optional: permanent marker



1. Preheat the oven to 200 degrees F.



- 3. Place the dough onto a flat surface sprinkled lightly with flour. Roll out the dough with a rolling pin to about a quarter-inch thick.
- 4. Have a grown-up use a butter knife to cut out a circle big enough to fit your pet's paw on. Smooth out the edges with your fingers.
- 5. Gently press your pet's paw into the middle of the circle.
- 6. Use a straw to poke a hole at the top of the ornament; this is where you will string the ribbon through later so you can hang the ornament on your tree. Be careful not to poke the hole too close to the edge.
- 7. Line a baking tray with parchment paper and place the ornament on it.
- 8. Bake the ornament for 10 minutes, then turn over and bake for another 10 minutes. When done, let cool on a baking rack.
- 9. Have a grown-up cut off a piece of decorative ribbon, thread it through the hole, and tie off into a bow.
- 10. Optional: write the date you made the ornament on the back of it with a permanent marker to mark the occasion.
