Accent the room with photos of buddies and family in lively-colored picture frames.



Below you'll find two options for this project. Option 1 requires purchasing Magnet Sheet Paper for Inkjet Printers. Option 2 can be done using household items.

Option 1: Materials: Ink Jet Printer Magnet Sheet Paper for Ink Jet Printer Sharp Knife or Scissors

Step 1: Print

Ruler

Load the magnet paper following manufacturer's instructions. (Handle paper by the edges to avoid fingerprints.) Print the **Frames Template**, being sure to print on the glossy surface (imaging side) of the paper. (For best results, load only one sheet at a time.)

Tips & Tricks:

To select the proper print settings in Adobe Acrobat, click Print; in the print dialog box, select Properties; choose the appropriate paper type and then select the highest print quality.

We recommend that you run a test print on regular paper to double-check that you're printing on the correct side of the paper. (If problems occur, check your printer manual for additional printing instructions.)

Step 2: Dry

Let paper dry several minutes before handling.

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Step 3: Cut

Cut along the outside edge of the frame. (For best results, use a sharp knife with a ruler as a guide.)

Step 4: Decorate!

Position your picture in the frame window and place the magnet onto your refrigerator or other metallic surface. (WARNING: Avoid placing magnets on electronic devices such as televisions and DVD players. Magnets can interfere with or damage these devices.)

Option 2:

Materials:

Construction Paper

Printer Paper

Cardboard

Sharp Knife or Scissors

Pencil or Pen

Glue

Step 1: Print

Load regular printer paper following manufacturer's instructions. Print the **Frames Template** using your ink jet printer. (Handle paper by the edges to avoid fingerprints.) For best results, load only one sheet at a time.

Step 2: Dry

Let paper dry several minutes before handling.

Step 3: Cut

Cut along the lines.

Step 4: Trace

Using the outside of the frame as a guide, trace onto construction paper.

Step 5: Cut

Cut the construction paper following the lines. This will be used as backing for the frame. Once you've selected a photo to display in your frame, place the construction paper piece behind the photo and glue to the frame.

Step 6: Cut Pattern Piece

Cut out the pattern piece labeled "frame stand."

Step 7: Trace Frame Stand

Trace the pattern piece onto cardboard paper.

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Step 8: Cut

Using heavy-duty scissors or a sharp knife, cut out the traced pattern on the cardboard. This will be used as the frame stand.

Step 9: Adhere Stand to Frame

Glue the frame stand to the back of the frame. Place the finished product on any countertop, desk, or stand.
