These special places are preserved for their natural beauty, diversity, history and amazing wildlife—from spouting geysers and gigantic peaks to twisting caves, crazy-deep lakes, and lands that are home to where buffalo roam.

PICK A PARK

There are national parks in all 50 states. Chances are there's one close to you!

Not able to visit a national park? Find out what fun you can have at a state or city park--from nature walks and paddle boating to birdwatching and more!

PLAN YOUR TRIP

Once you've picked a park, plan how to get there, and what to do when you arrive.

- MAP IT OUT. Download a map on the park's site (nps.gov), or grab an atlas.
- RESEARCH TRANSPORTATION. Planes? Trains? Automobiles? What works for you? Carpool or ride share whenever possible!
- CALL A RANGER. Talk to a park ranger to find out more about your destination.

PREPARE FOR ADVENTURE

Whether you're there for an hour or an entire week, national parks are full of activities!

- GO ON A HIKE. Try an easy nature walk or an overnight trekking adventure!
- PADDLE A CANOE OR KAYAK. Many parks have lakes or rivers to explore.
- GO FOR RIDE. Cruise along paved trails or go mountain biking and get muddy!
- HOP ON HORSEBACK. Some parks offer guided horseback, mule and even llama pack rides!
- TAKE A DIP. Dive into an ocean, lake or river. Some parks offer snorkeling too!
- WATCH WILDLIFE. How many different kinds of wildlife can you spot? Some may be species you won't see anywhere else in the world!
- CAMP OUT. Nothing lets you experience nature like sleeping under the stars!
- TELL GHOST STORIES. Gather 'round a campfire and tell spooky stories.
- GET OFFICIAL. Find out how to become a National Park
- Service Junior Ranger!
